Designed to improve the overall level of cyber security throughout the EU, its objectives are to develop a security culture throughout all member states. Supported by the NCSC, the directive is applicable to all UK sectors who are part of the Critical National Infrastructure (CNI) and rely heavily on IT such as operators in electricity, transport, water, energy, health, finance and digital infrastructure. During this presentation we will provide a background to the NIS Directive – Networks and Information Systems and discuss; the implementation timetable and its implications, the applicability to OESs and DSPs, the four guiding principles and what steps you need to take to prepare your business.</p>
